



## Making Stained Glass Windows

1. Invite the children to look at the examples of stained glass windows on page 72 of their texts.
2. Explain that today, they are going to make their own stained glass windows.
3. Ask the children to turn to page 327 of their texts and look at the listing of the Stations of the Cross. Explain that they can choose any of the fifteen stations as a theme for their window.
4. Distribute crayons, waxed paper, construction paper, and scissors.
5. Have the children draw their station on a piece of waxed paper.
6. When they have finished drawing, place another piece of waxed paper on top on the drawing and iron.
7. With construction paper, make a frame for the window. If possible, hang the stained glass windows in a window so that the sunlight can shine through.
