Making Stained Glass Windows

- 1. Invite the children to look at the examples of stained glass windows in their texts.
- 2. Explain that today, they are going to make their own stained glass windows.
- 3. Ask the children to look at the listing of the Stations of the Cross in their texts. Explain that they can choose any of the fifteen stations as a theme for their window.
- 4. Distribute crayons, waxed paper, construction paper, and scissors.
- 5. Have the children draw their station on a piece of waxed paper.
- 6. When they have finished drawing, place another piece of waxed paper on top of the drawing and iron.

7. With construction paper, make a frame for the window. If possible, hang the stained glass windows in a window so that the sunlight can shine through.
